Not being a bystander!

Great to see students not standing by if they see or hear anything they don't think is appropriate in our school community. Talking to staff or parents about what isn't ok is a great skill to develop that can be part of their skill base as they grow into adults. It is important that we work as a team to ensure we feel comfortable in our school environment. Calling out inappropriate behaviour is something that we encourage students to do, we need to know if something isn't right so we can work with the students concerned to try and sort the issue. This is a skill we will continue to work on.

A few students have brought these shoes to school last week. Staff have discussed their suitability in the yard and have made the decision they are not to be worn at school. We know they are great fun but school is not the place for students to wear them. Uniform

Attendance – still a significant issue for some of our student community....

Attendance is still an issue for a small number of our families. Absences have a significant impact on our student's lives. Missing days of schooling leaves students behind their peers both socially and academically. This term student absence continues to be an area of focus for our school, some of our students are significantly disadvantaged through their absence rate. The data below was shared with families earlier this year and demonstrates our school performance over the period 2014 – 2018.

Across Victorian schools, an absence rate of 12 days/year is the average. This equates to 3 days absence/per term/per child. Being below this figure is what schools would hope to see in their data.


In 2018, 37% of students had more than 20 days absence (4 weeks or ½ term). 33% had up to 10 days absence. This is of significant concern.

On the graph below, our aim for 2019 is to have less than 10% of students in the grey section and our other 90% in the green sections.

The reason we are aiming higher is because there is a clear correlation between attendance and achievement. We want all of our students to fulfil their academic and personal potential. By working together with families, we hope to achieve these goals. The Department of Education and Training is asking us to report significant absences for further follow up. Please make sure you send your child/ren to school every day. Thank you to the large number of families who are here all day, every day. It means a great deal to your child's education.

What can you do?

- Make appointments out of school hours.
- Ensure students are at school, ALL DAY, EVERY DAY
- Value school and the education your child receives, make it a priority.



This week in STEM we commenced our unit on Chemistry. Chemistry is a really fun area of science to explore and we started by being CSI scientists (Crime Scene Investigators).

Students were give mystery samples of four white powders. Using our investigative and science skills, students made observations about each powder, using descriptive words to describe each one. We then tested each substance with water and vinegar to test for solubility and acid-base reactions. Not knowing what the substances were, we were not allowed to taste them.

The investigative capabilities of our students was astounding. They identified the substances as Bicarb of soda, flour, icing sugar and regular sugar. Many of the junior students were really clever by describing the smell of flour mixed with water as cupcakes.

If your child has long hair we ask that they wear it tied back when they are attending school.






PROTECT


HEATHCOTE'S FIRST EARLY LEARNING CENTRE!
