Everyone has the right to be safe and be protected from abuse. No one should behave in a way that makes you feel unsafe or afraid, including anyone in your family, anyone at school or anywhere else in the community. Tell a teacher or any adult at your school if you feel unsafe.

WATER BOTTLES

All children are required to bring a water bottle to school. All water bottles should be clearly labelled with child's name. Water is the only beverage to be brought to school.

ABSENCES

All absences must be explained by a note each time your child is away from school. A phone call at the start of an absence is also appreciated and helps class organisation.

INSURANCE

As a public school, Heathcote Primary School does not provide any insurance for lost or stolen property for staff and students. We also do not provide any health insurance cover. In the event of an accident causing serious injury to a child, we must call an ambulance to ensure the child receives proper medical attention. The fees for the trip in an ambulance will be payable by the family whose child requires care. This is Department of Education and Training Policy.

MEDICAL AND CONTACT INFORMATION

It is vitally important that the school is able to make contact with parents/relatives/carers during school hours when necessary and that we have accurate medical information. Please make sure we have phone numbers that are up-to-date and that we are aware of any medical conditions your child has. Please contact Nina to update any information.

CSEF (Camps Sports and Excursion Fund)

<u>If you have a Healthcare Card you are eligible for the CSEF</u>. CSEF provides payments for eligible students to attend activities like: school camps or excursions, swimming and school-organised sports programs.

Contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form.

If you applied for the CSEF at your child's school in 2018, you do not need to complete an application form in 2019 unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form is any of the following have occurred:

- New student enrolment: your child has started or changed schools in 2019 or you did not apply in 2018.
- Changed family circumstances: such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number or new siblings commencing at the school in 2019.

Check with the school office if you are unsure.

Eligibility Date: For concession card holders CSEF eligibility will be subject to the parent/legal guardian's concession card being successfully validated with Centrelink on the first day of either Term 1 (29 January 2019) or Term 2 (23 April 2019). **Applications close 28 June 2019.**



Adult's classes are casual at \$12ea (come when you can) or \$95 (9-week term save \$13) paid in full upon registration.

More classes can become available upon demand, please discuss your needs with us as we can also run BABY & TODDLER CREATIVE RHYTHM & FUNK DANCE CLASSES, PRIME GROOVERS DANCE CLASSES & YOUTH GROOVERS DANCE CLASSES depending on demand.

We kindly ask that parents refrain from being in the room whilst class is running (unless necessary) to minimise distractions for the students.
