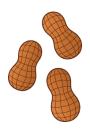

If you think you may be eligible, please contact the school office.


DRINK BOTTLE
