Staff will continue to develop what we do. From speaking with a number of colleagues across our region it is apparent schools implement what fits their school community. Since the beginning of home learning, teachers across Victoria and indeed Australia, continue to evolve the way they implement home learning that best matches the identified needs of their community. We will continue to tweak what we do, including the daily check in with teachers and other classroom friends which will provide a sense of connection for our students, this is something staff had been exploring and our families have expressed an interest in trying. 2021 DET Parent Opinion Survey



IN THE CLASSROOM

This week in the Foundation Room...

This week in the Foundation room our word of the week is 'beach'. We will have two focus digraphs this week.... /ea/ and /ch/. We will also be reading a writing some procedure texts such as recipes and instructions of how to play games.

In maths we are learning about position and location. We will learn how to give and follow directions using position words.

For inquiry we are continuing to learn about the Olympics. This week's focus we be on the sports that were completed in at the ancient Olympics compared to how many sports are competed in in the modern day Olympics.







IN THE CLASSROOM

This week in the Grade 3/4 Room...

In Literacy subjects, we are learning to write explanation texts that have a cause and effect relationship. The students will study 'how a particular organ of their body functions' and in contrast 'How the Egyptian pyramids were built in the 2500 BC.' In word work, we are exploring simple and complex sentences.

In Maths topics, we are continuing our work on number patterns and sequences.


Students will perfect their messaging skills in DT lessons by creating models using snap blocks designs. Writing a code so their partner can follow directions will be an interesting challenge.

In Reading sessions, we will continue practising our summarising skills through whole group and small guided reading group activities. We will also begin looking at the features of poetry and explore writing strategies when writing poems.

Miss Matthews will be introducing the topic of Geometry in maths lessons. We will be working with protractors and learning about angles.
