Principal's Report

What an action packed week we've had at Heathcote PS. Along with our core literacy and numeracy learning, students also participated in the whole school Science Fair (photos included in this newsletter). It was impressive to see students conducting their experiments with confidence and adaptability—science can be unpredictable! In my travels around the different demonstrations, I spotted a handmade replica of a velociraptor's skull, carefully engineered to having a moving jaw along with discovering that chalk does in fact 'bubble' when mixed with particular liquids and vinegar is the liquid (from those tested) that makes gummy bears expand the most. My thanks go to Dave for his leadership of the event and for supporting students to explore an area of STEM of particular interest to them. We certainly had an impressive variety of experiments and creations on display! Congratulations to all scientists for your enthusiasm and learning and thank you to families who were able to join us.



We are celebrating strong results in the Department of Education's annual **Attitudes to School Survey**. This survey is completed by students in Grades 4—6 annually. The preliminary results show growth in the percentage of positive responses in 20 of the 21 framework factors, with some areas increasing by 20%! Particular highlights include:

Effective classroom behaviour +11% Teacher concern +21% Learning confidence +15%

Effective teaching time +8%
Perseverance +12%
Student voice and agency +20%

We are the **grateful recipients** of a donation from the Reeve family to support our growing collection of **decodable texts** as part of our literacy program. Thank you! These texts have already made their way into our Foundation classroom. We will continue to build our bank of decodable text resources over the coming years.

School Wide Positive Behaviour Support

Our expected behaviours matrix has been finalised and published. A giant version makes its way to assembly where school leaders share an expected behaviour/s they have noticed as a strength within the school during the week and also set the school a challenge for the coming week. For example, strengths identified last week included 'We are inclusive', 'We walk' and 'We arrive on time'. The challenge for the week ahead is to 'return our sports equipment' and 'place rubbish in the correct bin'.





If you think you may be eligible, please contact the school office.


DRINK BOTTLE
