
Say hello to the person with Evie, not Evie

IN THE CLASSROOM


This week in the F/1 Room..

Due to it being such a short week next week with two days off and then our 100 Days AT School party we will be completing a few assessments.

In English we will also be having a big focus on correct formation of both upper and lower case letters in our writing.

In Maths we will be focussing on the numbers to 100 leading into our 100 Days AT School Party!

In Inquiry our focus is Australia. This week our focus will be on Australian animals and their habitats.











This week in the Grade 2 Room...

Welcome to Week 5!

A short week this week. In reading we will continue to focus on identifying the different text structures and features used for specific texts.

In writing, the students will work towards creating a procedure for their favourite milkshake. We will also begin to identify some common spelling patterns to help the students with working out unknown words.

In Maths, we will continue to work on Australian money, learning how to calculate change from simple and complex transactions.







IN THE CLASSROOM

This week in the Grade 3/4 Room...

On Thursday during Inquiry, the Grade 3/4 class continued their exploration of inventions and inventors. We discussed why people invent things, and the process by which this might happen. Students know that it takes resilience in continuing to try to find solutions when inventing something new, as the process can be frustrating! They experienced this when they were given the task of making a catapult from icy pole sticks, rubber bands, plastic forks, bottle top lids, glue and sticky tape. They did a wonderful job of experimenting with different designs and testing their catapult until they had done their best to make their projectile fly as far as possible.









The year 3/4 class has one last day with our student teacher Miss Mc Veigh on Friday this week. Miss Mc Veigh has been a wonderful support in our classroom. She has built lovely relationships with the students and I'm sure they will all miss having her around. We thank her for all that she has done and wish her the very best for her teaching career.

Our Numeracy this week will continue to focus on building confidence in solving subtraction problems successfully. We will also use brain training time to strengthen number and place value skills.

This week in literacy we are working on making predictions and posing questions about texts before we begin to read. Narratives are the text type focus for the next few weeks and we will be viewing some short movie clips to observe how good writers begin stories in dynamic ways.

IN THE CLASSROOM

This week in the Grade 4/5 Room

Students will be completing their Covid19 reporter presentations. Some students completed this last week and showed great confidence in becoming the classroom news reporter for a few minutes. Information and presentation research has been taken from Behind the news (BTN).

Students will also continue working on their data poster in mathematics, this week focusing on creating bar graphs.












This week in the Grade 5/6 Room...

This week during reading sessions, the class will be examining a variety of non-fiction texts and making comparisons. They will be looking for and discussing the similarities and differences within books about similar topics.

During Writing sessions we will be researching, planning and composing an information report based on the books we examine during reading lessons. We will be putting to practice, the skills we have learnt over the past couple of weeks regarding summarising.

In maths we will be focusing on Probability and Chance and engage in numerous activities that explore the outcomes of a range of events.

wolf tried to eat them up!


So they ran into the home

were dead.




Little Chicks, Little Chicks
