Absences

Thank you to those families who are notifying us of their child's absence. It is essential that we know when and why your child is away, all absences are recorded and sent to DET. We know students get sick, however students should be at school all day every day. Regular absences and even running 10 - 15 minutes late each day adds up, this can result in significant impacts on learning. If possible, appointments should be made out of hours to enable students to be at school for the whole day. We appreciate families letting us know when their child is away.

Healthy lunchboxes and packaging

Getting the right fuel into our bodies is very important for all of us! Having breakfast is a great way to get ready for the day. We have seen some great lunchboxes - salad sandwiches, chicken or tuna wraps, vegetable sticks and dip, boiled eggs, cheese and biscuits, yogurt, fruit and one treat! In the past few years we have asked students to bring in 'nude food' – no packaging. Using small containers and putting them inside lunchboxes helps students keep their food organised without packaging. If you buy in bulk you can just put things in containers. We will be having an increased focus on healthy eating and nude food next year. One of the DET Victorian goals for 2021 is to have active, healthy kids. Now is the time to get into the food routine!

Auslan

In 2021 we will be introducing Auslan as the language we offer at our school. Our School Council have been very excited and supportive of us beginning this language next year. Miss McKinnell is trained in AUSLAN as well as Indonesian, she is very excited to be working with us in introducing this new component in our curriculum. Auslan is short for Australian Sign Language. Many of you will have become very accustomed to seeing Auslan interpreters standing alongside the Premier this year as he delivered many news conferences. Auslan is another language, instead of speaking, it is signed using facial expressions in addition to hand and body movements. The Australian Deaf community have been using Auslan for over 100 years. We are excited to be starting this new journey next year.

Whole school assembly

In the last week of school, we will be having a whole school assembly outside to enable families to join in. Next week we will be checking the weather to see which day would be best and name the day. The assembly will be held first thing in the morning to ensure there are no heat issues, keep reading your emails and newsletter to see the date. We are looking forward to having everyone together again!

Sunscreen

As part of our Sun Smart Policy, students are encouraged to wear sunscreen when they go outside for breaks or PE. The school has sunscreen available for student use. If you prefer to use your own, please send it along to school with your child. The UV rays are getting very high as we head into summer, protecting our skin is very important.




Newsletter article: Bushfire At Risk Register - Schools

School procedures for the bushfire season

Fire danger ratings and warnings are used in Victoria to provide clear direction on the safest options for preserving life.

Schools and children's services listed on the DET Bushfire At-Risk Register (BARR) will be closed when a Code Red fire danger rating day is determined in their Bureau of Meteorology district. Our school has been identified as being one of those at high bushfire risk and is listed on the BARR.



FIRE DANGER RATING

Where possible, we will provide parents with up to four days notice of a potential Code Red day closure by letter and/or email. A Code Red day will be determined by the Emergency Management Commissioner no later than 1.00 pm the day before the potential closure. Once we are advised of the confirmation of the Code Red day we will provide you with advice before the end of the school day.

Once confirmed, the decision to close will not change, regardless of improvements in the weather forecast. This is to avoid confusion and help your family plan alternative care arrangements for your child. It is also important to note that:

- No staff will be on site on days where the school is closed due to a forecast Code Red day.
- School camps will be cancelled if a Code Red fire danger rating day is determined for the Bureau of Meteorology district in which the camp is located.
- As a bus co-ordinating school all bus routes will be cancelled.

Depending on which Bureau of Meteorology district is impacted bus route cancellations may affect our school.

On these Code Red days families are encouraged to enact their Bushfire Survival Plan – on such days children should never be left at home or in the care of older children.

• For those of us living in a bushfire prone area, the Country Fire Authority (CFA) advises that when Code Red days are forecast, the safest option is to leave the night before or early on the morning of the Code Red day. As part of preparing our school for potential hazards such as fire, we have updated and completed our Emergency Management Plan.



What can parents do?

Make sure your family's bushfire survival plan is up-to-date and includes alternative care arrangements in the event that our school is closed.

• Ensure we have your current contact details, including your mobile phone numbers. Keep in touch with us by reading our newsletters, if you have any questions do not hesitate to contact the school.

Most importantly at this time of year, if you're planning a holiday or short stay in the bush or in a coastal area, you should check warnings in advance of travel and remain vigilant during your stay.

If your child is old enough, talk to them about bushfires and your family's bushfire survival plan.



IN THE CLASSROOM

This week in the F/1 Room..

This week in Reading we will be learning about poetry and rhyme. We will be reading lots of rhyming books and trying to identify the rhyming words. In writing we will be learning how to write a few different types of poems.

In Maths we will be focussing on 'Friends of 10', trying to learn all of the combinations to 10 which will help up with our addition and subtraction skills.

In Inquiry we are continuing to learn about 'Celebrations around the word'. This week we will be learning about Chinese New Year and Hanukkah.





This week in the Grade 2 Room...

In our reading sessions, we will be reading Christmas letters written by people from around the world.

In writing, the students will focus on finalising their creative writing projects and begin to animate their stories using the iPads.

In Maths, we will look at shapes and their properties. The students will identify 3D shapes in the environment and look at how they are similar/different to other shapes. We will also begin to measure and create some of the 3D shapes.





IN THE CLASSROOM

This week in the Grade 3/4 Room...

The much anticipated African Drumming incursion will take place this week and we are also very busy organising our special end of year celebration down at the Barack Reserve. If you could return your permission slips for this excursion as soon as possible, it would be greatly appreciated.

As the year comes to a close we are still working really hard in the classroom to cover a variety of Literacy and Numeracy topics. This week in literacy we are studying poetry and alliteration techniques. Literary review will be our writing focus as we critique our shared classroom novels.

The students will continue to focus on skip counting and times tables in their Brain Training time each Maths lesson. The lesson will continue to focus on Division, using the students' knowledge of skip counting to assist with connecting multiplication and division. Students will have the opportunity to work as a whole group and in smaller groups to complete different tasks.

We've been working really hard in Art lessons to make boats using sewing techniques as you can see!



IN THE CLASSROOM

This week in the Grade 4/5 Room

We continued to work on our narratives in the Grade 4/5 room this week. The students are enjoying creating picture story books from their work. We look forward to sharing our books with each other.

During our reading we have been using a range of strategies to recognise and take apart words, and understand their meaning. The students have demonstrated excellent comprehension skills during their Guided Reading Sessions.

We have begun our new topic of "Money" in mathematics. We have looked at money as decimals, and enjoyed playing money-based board games to practice our skills. We have also looked at online supermarket catalogues to budget for a hypothetical party.

This week in the Grade 5/6 Room...

During Week 10 the Grade 5/6 class will learn about the features of writing and delivering a speech. Students will focus on developing their skills in speech writing, appropriate body composure and the use of vocal tone and expression. Grade 5 students will be working on a leadership speech in preparation for the 2021 Leadership team nominations and Grade 6 students will be working on Graduation speeches.

In Maths lessons students will revise by referring to their exercise books and identifying subjects that require attention.

We are very excited to be involved in African Drumming on Thursday. It will be wonderful to welcome Laura Kirkwood back to Heathcote Primary School.


